**Required equipment:** Helmet,  
boots, saddle and pad, bridle,  
halter with 12-foot lead.

No stallions allowed.

Overnight camping is allowed Friday and Saturday nights. Grounds open at 3 p.m. Fri., May 14. If staying overnight, be prepared to tie horses to trailers or bring portable corrals. Dry camp with access to water faucets. Limited number of stock corrals available - call for more information.

**Directions to Driscoll Ranch** from the Bay Area —HWY 280 to Woodside Road Exit (Hwy 84). Southwest on 84 through La Honda. From La Honda, continue approximately 5 miles to the Driscoll Ranch entrance on left (look for the rearing black horse.)
