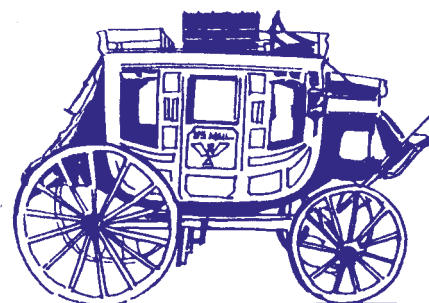

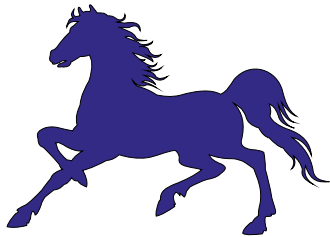
President's Message continued

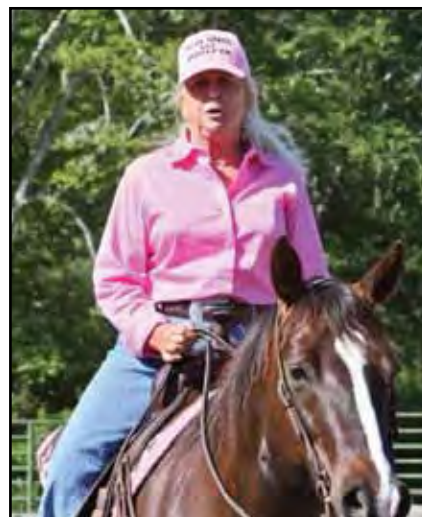
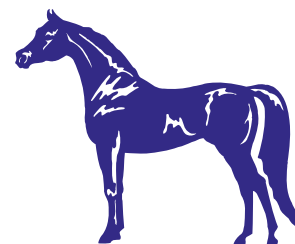

For those of you that don't know the game of Bunco it is a very inter-active, partner-changing, table changing game with a lot of laughter going on among the players and this year was no different!

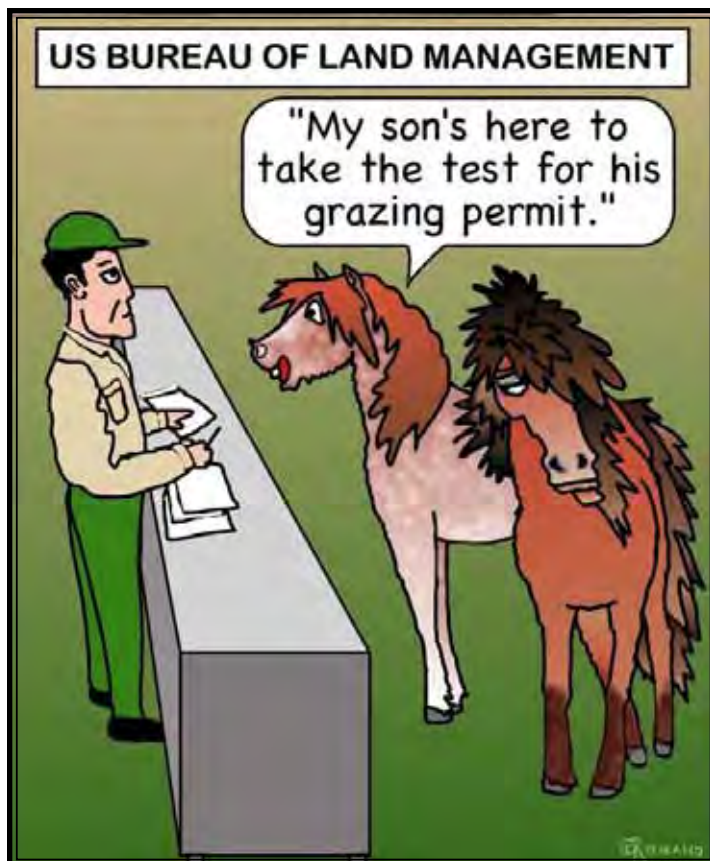

Spaghetti Squash Recipe

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Cut squash in 1/2 lengthwise and scoop out all seeds. Rub them inside and out with a little olive oil and season with salt and pepper. Place the squash cut side down in a baking dish and add enough water to come 1/2-inch up the sides of the baking dish. Cover with foil and place in the oven and cook until the rind is slightly soft or gives with a little pressure, about 20-45 minutes (depending on size). You can also test it by turning it over and scrape the sides with a fork, if it pulls away easy it is done. You don't want to over cook the squash it should be al dente. Remove from the oven, uncover, turn them over and allow them to cool slightly. Using a fork, gently pull the strands of squash away from the peel and place the squash strands in a bowl, keep warm.

Add a little butter, olive oil, juice from 1/2 lemon (more if squash is large), salt and pepper to taste and mix gently. You can top it off with a little Parmesan cheese for a great finale. Enjoy!

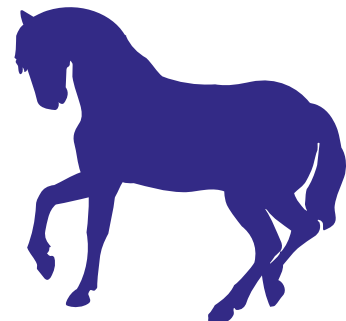

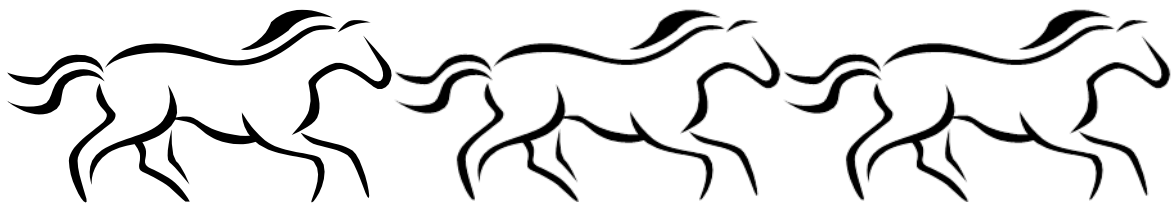

SAN MATEO COUNTY SHERIFF'S MOUNTED SEARCH AND RESCUE CAPTURES NATIONAL MEDIA ON CLINTON ANDERSON DOWNUNDER HORSEMANSHIP IN TWO RFD- TV EPISODES!

The San Mateo County Sheriff's Mounted Search and Rescue Unit (MSAR) had the honor of hosting renowned horse trainer, Clinton Anderson and his crew last August as they filmed for his Downunder Horsemanship TV show. After six days of filming and several months later, the crew initially mailed out a two hour DVD to all of Anderson's No Worries Club Members (approximately 14,000 fans). In addition, they produced 2 one hour TV shows with new footage that aired across the nation and are now showing on a website worldwide.

In the two TV shows that recently aired, the beautiful scenery of San Mateo County was on display as MSAR unit members, many of which are also SMCHA members, were seen riding on the picturesque Coastal Trail, Poplar Beach and around the Redwoods and rolling hills at Driscoll Ranch. More scenic icons were featured as members were interviewed at a foggy Montara Lighthouse and around the barns at NCEFT in Woodside.

At Driscoll Ranch, unit members and their horses were challenged with sensory tests like flares, lights and sirens on a squad car, and a "car wash" – all with Anderson's helpful guidance on how to improve their horse's training. Buddy bound issues and trail riding problems were also addressed using Anderson's Downunder Horsemanship training techniques. The last segment of the TV series portrays a search for a "missing" Anderson whose Australian

humor while on walkabout makes the search even more entertaining and includes a unique way of packing out a search subject. During the mock search, the Sheriff's Com Bus provided communications and from the vantage point of the Cal Star Helicopter there are some dramatic scenes as they fly over the hills and searching horses.

San Mateo County Sheriff's representative, Sgt. Joe Sheridan, and several MSAR members were interviewed for the shows providing insight not only into their experience working with Anderson and the techniques used to train their horses, but also sharing their expertise about search and rescue and how the horses play such an important role as a search partner. Kelley Hix, who shares leadership of the unit with Casey Terribilini said, "Since the shows aired we've been contacted by several Mounted Search and Rescue Units across the nation for advice on everything from how we train our horses to where we get our breast collars from! We've also received numerous compliments from the general public thanking us for our service. This opportunity turned out to be a great way to showcase what MSAR units across the country are capable of doing."

Although Anderson gave the unit some valuable horse training tips, the unit was also able to send something home with him in exchange - the idea of using flares and sirens for desensitizing horses at his own training facility in Stephenville, TX.

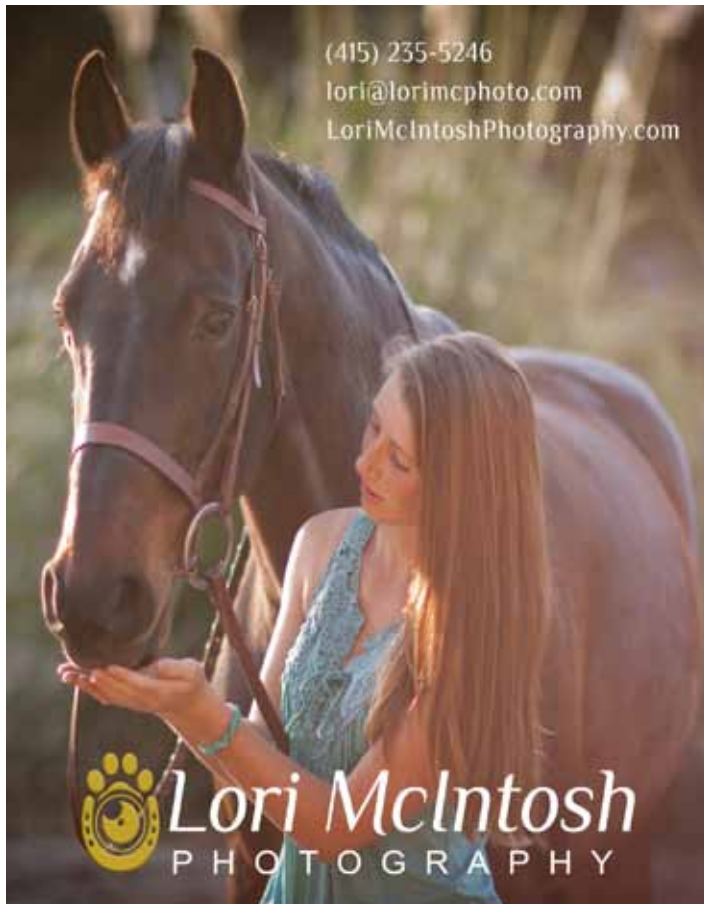

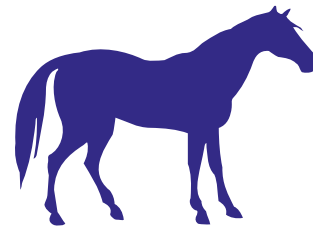


LET'S HITCH UP !

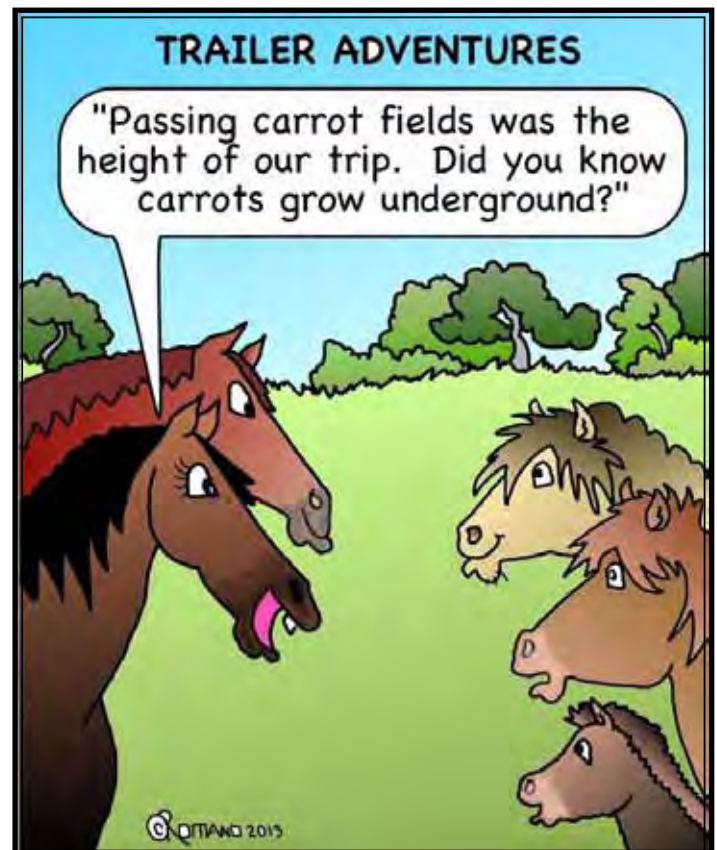

OBITUARIES

Howard Boone



Howard Davis Boone Passed away peacefully at his home on January 14, 2013 at 93 years of age. A native of Iowa, he started his education in a one-room schoolhouse, arriving each day on horseback. He eventually won a scholarship to Iowa State, where he earned a Bachelor's degree in 1940 in Agricultural Economics. Following graduation, he joined Cargill, an international agribusiness headquartered in Minneapolis. When the war broke out in 1941, he joined the Navy Air Corps as the first aviation cadet sworn in after Pearl Harbor. In 1946 he married Nancy Goulet, and after that he returned to Cargill, where he spent his entire career, rising to Vice President of the company's Pacific Rim oil

seed processing businesses, which included the Philippines, Australia, and New Zealand. Howard also loved to travel and, with Nancy, visited numerous countries around the world, but always loved best to return to his favorite beach in Maui. In 1960, Howard and Nancy moved with their family to Woodside, where he was involved in numerous civic activities in the local community, serving on the Board of Directors of the Woodside Trail Club, as Chairman of the Woodside Town Trails Committee, and as president of the Woodside Community Foundation. He remained an active horseman throughout his life. In 1974 he was elected captain of the Mounted Patrol, and in 1994 he was given the Outstanding Horseman-Citizen Award by the San Mateo County Mounted Patrol. In 2005, he was honored by the town of Woodside when it named a riding trail after him. Howard was quoted as saying "Living with horses brings out the human side of a person, the part that wants to do something to help others or help out in your community."

Howard will be remembered as a loving and devoted husband, father, and grandfather, as well as a big fan of the Niners and Giants, who he finally got to see win not one but two World Series. He was predeceased by his daughter Janet Lee and by his beloved wife Nancy. He is survived by his daughters Kathy Boone (Bruce Raskin), Betsy Harms (Steve), and Bonnie Boone-Altshuld (Steve) and his six grandchildren, Rebecca, Sarah, Christine, Max, Leslie, and Gabe.

Today, horses and humans alike mourn the loss of our beloved Deb Cooper who passed on Sunday March 3 at her home on Moon Valley Ranch. Deborah Anne Cooper was born on January 21, 1956 at Children's Hospital of San Francisco to Eleanor Piers. She spent her early years in Miami, Florida and Piedmont, California.

An avid athlete, Deb swam competitively throughout her childhood. She also played soccer at the first Gay Games in San Francisco and was a member of the first women's professional soccer team. However, her life's calling became apparent through her Aunt Mary, a racehorse breeder. The deep love and connection that Deb shared with horses was there-to-fore unprecedented.

Deb's spirit was most in line when she was with her horses; it was a bond felt by both. She nurtured her natural skill through mentor Pat Parelli, who helped her to fine tune and nourish her communication. It was a training based in a mutual trust and respect for the animal; a way of being that deeply resonated with her own sense of self. She

became a Level 3 Star instructor, specializing with troubled horses and colt starting. It is difficult to discern who saved the other first. What is known is that with her horses, Deb experienced an inner peace that was unparalleled.

Over the next 30 years, Deb translated her passion into a business, training hundreds of horses and humans. She owned and developed three horse ranches in Santa Cruz County – each building upon the other – the most recent of which is Moon Valley Ranch. She shared her gifts with the community, creating a space that centered on horse/human education and healing. Moon Valley Ranch was also an operating site for HorsePower horse rescue, as Deb continued on her journey of guiding damaged or misunderstood horses to discovering their true potential as powerful, beautiful creatures of elegance.

Deb has joined her brother, Thomas Cooper, who preceded her in death. She is survived by her mother Eleanor Piers, sister Pamela Harris, brother Robert Cooper, three children – Sam, Hannah and Tess Bouten, and her final partner in life, Jules Rodriguez.

Deb leaves behind a legacy of rich knowledge and natural horsemanship skills. She touched the spirit of horses and humans in her teaching and inspired each rider to find that place of calm, respectful relationship with their equine partners. She will be as deeply missed as she is deeply loved.

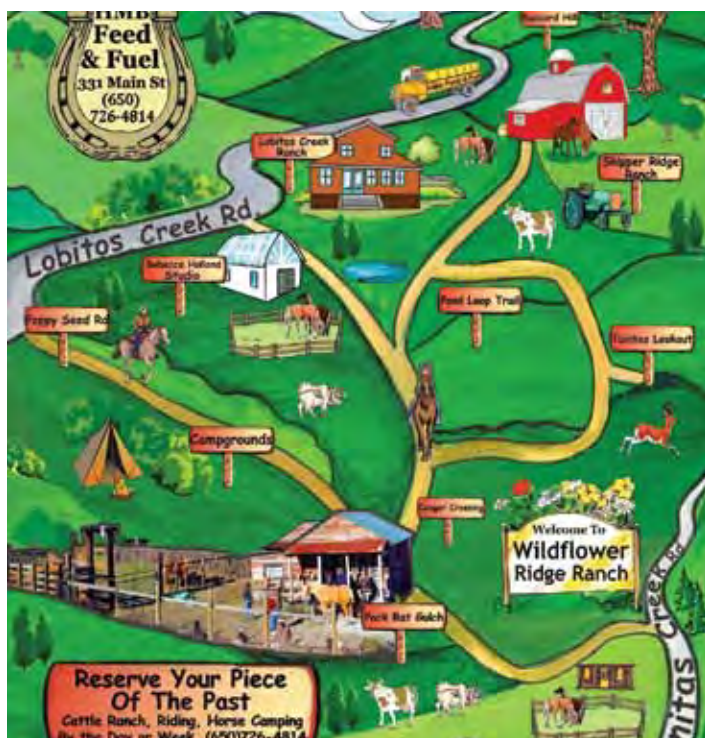
